Eligibility Criteria for MBBS in Netherlands

With over **90,000** international students, Netherlands requires academic and language qualifications for those, including those from India, pursuing an MBBS-equivalent degree.

The program consists of a 3-year Bachelor's and a 3-year Master's in Medicine, after which you can register as a medical doctor and specialize.

 - Possible interviews or additional tests
 - This procedure assesses the applicant's suitability for the MBBS program.

Step 5: Await the Ranking Number

- Studielink will release ranking numbers for applicants, determining your position relative to others.

- If your ranking falls within the available spots, you will be offered a place in the program.

Step 6: Accept the Offer

- If you receive an offer, accept it through Studielink within two weeks.
- Failure to accept will result in losing your place, which will be offered to the next candidate.

Step 7: Finalize Enrollment

- After accepting the offer, complete the enrollment process, including:
- Payment of tuition fees
- Submission of final transcripts or certificates
- Arrangements for housing and health insurance

Additional Considerations

- **Application Deadlines:** The general deadline for numerus fixus programs is January 15. However, it's essential to check the specific deadline for your chosen program, as it may vary.
- **Language Requirements:** Proficiency in Dutch is required for master's programs. Make sure you meet the language requirements before applying.
- **Visa and Residence Permit:** As an international student, you'll need to apply for a student visa and residence permit. Start the process early to prevent any delays.
